One very important factor in the smooth operation of our community is the attention residents pay to the guidelines and rules found in the Handbook. I know the Handbook is the last thing most people would find entertaining reading, but it is very helpful for residents to read it. For example, in it you would find the following information about recycling and guest suite policies. When residents are unaware or ignore policies such as these, it creates an additional burden on staff. They must then spend their time and attention correcting the error.

Recycling

Please read the list of acceptable items and only put those in the recycling bins. Plastic bags, hangers, furnace filters ARE NOT acceptable items. Please be mindful of what products can be recycled and of not putting boxes in the recycling bin. There are lists of acceptable items posted by the recycling totes. Small boxes must be broken down prior to placing them in the recycling tote. Large boxes should be taken to the first-floor dumpster.

#### **Guest Suite Policies**~

There are policies that cover usage, cancellation, and charges for the guest suites. Sometimes it may be tempting for a resident who has reserved a suite and decides to change their reservation to "work something out" with another resident who needs a guest suite. Doing this results in confusion and a tremendous amount of extra work for Sheryl which prevents her from attending to her other responsibilities in the building. ### Saturday, May 3rd 2025 - restricted access to garages

This year the Flying Pig races will take place the first weekend in May (May 2 - 4). On Saturday, May 3rd starting at 7:00 am, there will be restricted access to the garage entrance on Butler St. from approximately 7 am - 10:00 am.

We will work with Cincinnati Police to allow you to park on Sentinel as we have in the past. The staff with the Flying Pig will hire a security guard to monitor the street overnight.

Residents that will need to get out of the garage during this time will need to park on Sentinel the night before. The Flying Pig has sent over parking passes that you can use to put on your vehicle if you do need to park on Sentinel. Tags will be available at the front desk the week of the event.

## POLICY & PROCEDURES: REMINDER FOR COMMUNITY ROOM & POLK ROOM RESERVATIONS

To ensure a smooth experience when renting the Community Room or Polk Room, please review the guidelines outlined in the Park Place Handbook. Additionally, you must complete the Reservation Application and submit the required deposit before your reservation is confirmed.

### **Key Requirements:**

- Room Layout Submission: Provide your room layout at least five (5) days before your event.
- Valet Service Notification: Inform the Management Office if you plan to use a valet service.
  - \* Staging & Access: Valet services must be staged out front. Once a vehicle is parked, valets must return to the staging area by walking around the building—they are not permitted to commute through the building or receive a key fob.

### **Guest Guidance Signage:**

- If you are hosting a party, we strongly recommend posting a sign in the lobby to direct your guests. Black metal floor signs are available in the Management Office upon request.
- A second sign should be placed just outside the reserved room's entrance. Additional floor signs are stored inside the room for your convenience.


